As a Full Governing Body we meet at least once per term and the two subcommittees also meet once per term.

### **Curriculum and Standards sub committee.**

This committee focuses on the standards of teaching and learning and student progress.

### **Human Resources and Finance sub committee.**

This committee focuses on staffing levels across all areas whilst balancing the budget. This committee also monitors the physical structure of the College including H&S.

Governors are appointed from relevant stake holders within the College community and may be from either the parent or staff fraternity, alternatively may be appointed by the local authority or the community or may be co-opted. All governors are charged by the DfE with three core strategic functions.

- **Ensuring clarity of vision, ethos and strategic direction;**

This we do by working with the College leadership team to develop a mid to long term improvement plan which is both visionary and realistic and that encompasses the college ethos, ensuring our visions and values are suitable to prepare our students for the challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> century.

- **Holding the head teacher to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils;**

This we do by tracking the performance of ALL groups of students and ensuring that each student is treated as an individual receiving an enriched


education suitable to their needs and ensuring all are challenged to achieve their full potential.
