YOUR CHILD'S HPV VACCINATION IS NOW DUE

The high uptake of the HPV vaccine among girls has reduced the overall risk of unvaccinated boys and girls coming into contact with the HPV viruses. For the first time we are extending our HPV vaccination programme to boys age 12-13.

Girls age 12-13 in school years 8 and 9 are offered the HPV (Human Papilloma Virus) vaccination and boys in year 8 are now being offered this as part of the NHS childhood immunisation programme. The vaccine protects against HPV related cancers such as cervical cancer in women and throat and neck cancers in both men and women; it is offered at schools in England as a course of 2 injections. In this first year of delivery for boys, they will receive their first dose in year 8 and second dose the following year, which is consistent with the HPV vaccination programme for girls.

According to Cancer Research UK, cervical cancer is the second most common cancer in women under the age of 35. In the UK, 2900 women a year are diagnosed with cervical cancer - that is around eight women every day. It is estimated that about 400 lives could be saved every year in the UK as a result of vaccinating girls before they are infected with HPV. The number of diagnoses of genital warts in England has also fallen sharply in both girls and boys since the vaccination programme started, suggesting that boys are already benefiting indirectly from the girls' programme through 'herd immunity' protection. Extension of the HPV programme will save even more lives.

You will need to enter the unique code for your child's school. The code is **EE112041**. Please submit your form by **Wednesday 18th September** to ensure your child receives their vaccination. submitted your child will **not** be vaccinated. If you decide not to have your child vaccinated please let us know so we can enter this on your child's medical records.

- If you submitted a form giving consent for your daughter to be immunised when she was in year 8, you do not need to re-submit. This is because you have consented to the full treatment, i.e. 2 doses of the vaccine. If you are unsure, please call the team on **01872 221105/06** and they will be able to advise.
- **Please note: Your child can self-consent to treatment if they are considered competent to do so by one of our nurses; this is known as Gillick competency. If you require any further information in this regard, please contact us.**
