### Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

This term is flying by again with the October half term closing in very quickly. There has been an array of academic, sporting and extra-curricular activities taking place with the College feeling particularly vibrant.

We are hoping to repeat this event later in the year - watch out for details in future Newsletters.




