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Reporting your child's absence



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Year 11 Mock Interview Day

On October 12th we welcomed a range of local employers and different businesses into the College to complete mock job interviews with year 11 students. The aim of the day was to help students practice their interview skills and to increase their confidence in an interview situation. Students may have interviews for 6th forms, College courses and Apprenticeships in the near future. We would like to thank Julie Putman, the College's Enterprise Advisor for her help in contacting the local business and organisations. We had representatives attending from Babcock, NHS Apprenticeships, Food Standards Agency, the Army, DWP, STEM Ambassadors, Crystal Wood Consultancy, a Financial Advisor, RPS Consulting, Libra Property, the Royal Society for Chemistry, and a former student who is now an Engineer working for Aecom. Year 11 students completed some tasks in tutor to prepare for the day, considering how to make a good first impression, effective communication skills, the types of questions asked in a job interview and examples of how to answer them effectively using the STAR method. The students performed so well on the day, looked smart in their interview clothes and really pushed themselves out of their comfort zones to take part. Students received feedback and next steps following their interviews. The next aim is to ensure that all year 11 students have an up-to-date CV.



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Anti-Bullying Advice

What is bullying?

Bullying is defined as the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group.

How can parents and carers help?

- If you think your child is being bullied, don't panic try to keep an open mind. Your key role is listening, calming and providing reassurance that the situation can get better when action is taken.
- Listen and reassure them that coming to you was the right thing to do – It may not be easy for a child to talk about being bullied so it is important to try to find out how they are feeling and what has happened, when and where.
- Assure them that the bullying is not their fault and that you are there to support them
- Don't encourage your child to retaliate hitting back, or responding online has unpredictable results and can lead to your child also getting into trouble.
- Discuss the situation with the school TCC has a policy in place to deal with bullying and will take all steps necessary to investigate and resolve the issue

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
