Well done to our incredibly talented students, staff and I friends of TCC who performed at our Christmas Party Pieces. It was a fantastic evening enjoyed by all.















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
Christmas Challenge




This is now the fourth year of GCHQ Christmas Challenge, but what is the GCHQ?...read on to find out what they have to say:

"The Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ for short) is one of the three UK Intelligence and Security Agencies, along with MI5 and the Secret Intelligence Service (MI6). GCHQ protects the UK and its citizens from individuals, groups and countries who wish to do us harm, or damage us financially. We work round the clock to help to keep the country safe. Our brilliant people use cuttingedge technology, technical know-how and wide-ranging partnerships to identify, analyse and disrupt threats. We always strive to stay one step ahead."



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
