

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Funding success for 9x9 3G Football Turf Pitch

The design, construction and build of a 9v9 3G Football Turf Pitch to benefit Torpoint and the Rame Peninsula is among several projects across Cornwall to share almost £1.8m in grants from Cornwall Council.

Cornwall Council launched the third round of the Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) Fund last summer, to fund infrastructure projects that benefit children and young people. Now, after a vigorous and competitive application and selection process, the successful projects have been announced.

Olly Monk, Cornwall Council cabinet portfolio holder for housing and planning, said: "The Community Infrastructure Levy allows us to raise funds from new developments and pass this on to community projects making a real difference.

"With this funding we are able to support many worthwhile schemes and organisations working to improve facilities and access to opportunities."

CIL payments are set aside to be spent on infrastructure projects to benefit communities and support development. Between 15 to 25 per cent of the levy goes to the town or parish council where the development has taken place.

The remaining CIL collected is used to deliver infrastructure that will help alleviate the wider impact of development.

Applicants needed to show how there was local need and community support for their project, as well as how the projects will directly support children and young people in their area.

Torpoint Town Council is among 26 successful applicants and has been offered £85,000 to support the design, construction and build of a 9v9 3G Football Turf Pitch on the grounds of Torpoint Community College. This project is a collaborative effort between Torpoint Community College; Torpoint Town Council; Torpoint YMCA; the Football Foundation; Torpoint and Rame Active Community Network and the Cornwall FA and aims to provide a state-of-the-art facility for the benefit of College students' and the wider community. The aim is to start building the facility in Spring 2025 ready to open for the commencement of the academic year in September 2025.

Councillor Gary Davis, Mayor of Torpoint said "As one of my Mayor's Charities for the year, I am delighted the project has been allocated this CIL funding and am grateful to the community for supporting the continued fundraising efforts for the 3G Football Turf Pitch.

The project has already received positive feedback from various stakeholders, including local football clubs, the local parish councils, community groups, Argyle Community Trust, Cornwall FA and the Football Foundation. The Football Foundation has indicated they would support a funding bid for a 9v9 3G Football Turf Pitch in Torpoint, as it would meet their criteria for sustainability, demand and impact. The project would also align with the Cornwall FA's strategic plan to increase participation and retention in football, especially among under-represented groups such as women and girls, and disabled people."

A fourth round of the CIL Fund is expected be the launched in the spring. More information on CIL and previous rounds of the fund are available at <u>www.cornwall.gov.uk/cil</u>.





Please see below an important message in the Cornwall Council Weekly Update regarding the rise in Measles cases.

Measles - Signs and Symptoms

Measles can be a very serious disease, leading to ear and chest infections, fits, diarrhoea, and damage to the brain. Measles can kill. Measles usually starts with cold like symptoms followed by a rash.

Measles outbreaks happen when not enough children have been vaccinated. Children are at risk of measles if they haven't had the MMR vaccination. The MMR vaccine is highly effective at protecting against measles, two doses of MMR vaccine are needed to get the best protection. If your child is due to have had two doses of MMR but has not yet received them, no matter what age they are, you should contact your GP to get them vaccinated as soon as possible.

If you can't remember if your child has had any, one or two doses of MMR vaccine, check his or her personal child health record (the Red Book). If this doesn't help, speak to your GP. If you don't know how many doses your child has had, it's better to have two doses of MMR vaccine now rather than risk leaving them unprotected.



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U16 Girls County Cup Update!

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Our wonderful U16 Girls Football Team have finished in the top 4 in Cornwall this year for the County Cup competition.

Torpoint V Liskeard 7-4

The competition kicked off before Christmas in an 11-goal thriller match with a 7-4 win against local rivals Liskeard. This was the start of a good run for Torpoint.

Saltash V Torpoint 2-3

It was a bitterly cold day today, but the girls were ready for their quarter-final match.

The girls went 1-0 down within 45 seconds as I think they were still defrosting from the warm-up! In true TCC spirits we patiently waited for our reward despite numerous attacks, and Saskia equalised to make it 1-1. This was the kickstart the girls needed, and they were now much more settled and playing some lovely football against a well turned out Saltash. The girls went into half time at 1-1 and the score is a true reflection on the display from the first half. TCC came out brighter in the second half making use of the fresh legs coming on the pitch. Poppy S (who was playing in a competition above her age!) calmly slotted the ball in the net to make it 2-1. Saltash fought back and missed an opportunity which would have seen the score equalised. Thankfully, a brave effort in goal from Olivia B kept Saltash away. The game was far from over and Saltash hit the post, before Lola N narrowly missed a shot down the other end. 
We would love for parents/carers in Cornwall to join us for our first engagement workshop.
