Headteacher's Message

Dear parents and carers,

This half term has simply flown by. When we return from next week's break Spring will be rapidly approaching, and I very much look forward to the lighter mornings and evenings.

On Tuesday it was Safer Internet Day so this week our assemblies have focused on e-safety. Technology is changing so fast online and it is often difficult to keep up with what children are doing on social media and the internet. We also had another careers event on Thursday, with it being National Apprenticeship week, and there was a focus on our Year 8. Last week, Year 11 were rewarded with a mufti day for their excellent behaviour and attendance during their mock examinations. On Wednesday we had our Year 11 Mock Results Evening and there was an



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excellent turnout for this event. Following short presentations on strategies to support revision, managing time, managing stress, some practical examples on revision strategies and finally information on how to apply for a Sixth Form place, the students were given their much awaited mock results. It is important our Year 11 keep focused and use the relatively short time between now and their GCSE exams as constructively and productively as possible. We are here to support them and it is important they speak to their tutors or subject teachers should they have any concerns.

There have been a number of sporting fixtures since the last newsletter. I would like to congratulate our Year 8 boys who made the Last 16 of the National Cup football competition. Last week they faced LVC Ascot, finalists from last year's competition, and this was clearly a step up compared to some previous rounds. Unfortunately they lost the game 4-0, but they can hold their heads high for all that they have achieved. Congratulations also to our Year 7 netball squad, who have qualified for the County final against the West County finalists in a few weeks time.

On Monday a letter was sent out to all parents regarding a uniform change from September 2024. The decision has been made to introduce the proposed new kilt style skirt. A summary of the uniform change is outlined below:

Year 7 to 11 students – options to wear:

A checked kilt-style skirt which can be purchased from the College's designated uniform supplier.

Plain, black "classic" style trousers. These should be straight legged and not tight. There should be no large belts, zips on the sides or buckles and belts should be plain black. Trousers should not be of a denim fabric, chinos or leather.

Plain black "city" shorts or tailored black shorts. Not cargo style or sports shorts.

I would like to thank everyone who fed back on the proposed uniform change as part of the consultation process.

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Year 10 Trip to The Duchy College Experience Day

The whole of Year 10 were invited, and 45 students took up the offer, to attend the Year 10 Experience Day at Duchy College. The aim of the trip was to show students what our nearest land based College of Further Education is like and the variety of courses on offer there, which ranges from level 1 courses right up to degree level.

Students took part in 2 activities during their day ranging from finding out about the level 2 and level 3 Agricultural courses, which included a tractor and trailer ride to visit the Future Farm, taking part in an Animal Care session to find out about the level 2 and 3 courses in Animal Care, to finding out about the Equine Studies courses and meeting the horses. Other sessions allowed students to find out about the Public Service courses, which help prepare students to join the Police and Armed Services, and the Sport and Outdoor Education courses.

It was fantastic to see the campus and meet the staff and to have this opportunity. Thank you to all the staff and students who took part in the day and to Duchy College, Cornwall College for funding the transport so the trip was free to students. 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




Come along for a morning of Lego fun. In the afternoon our library staff have organised a little messy fun in the kids area.


