#### Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents and Carers,

February has been another busy but productive month at TCC with our students continuing to impress us with their talents and efforts. Year 11 and 13 students are now very much focused on preparing for their examinations, working hard to ensure they succeed in the summer. Our various sports teams are representing the College in a range of fixtures, consistently demonstrating excellent teamwork and commitment. And a number of students are rehearsing for our upcoming production of We Will Rock you.

There is a relatively short period of time now before the start of the summer exam season. It is therefore really important our Year 11 and 13 students utilise this time wisely to consolidate their knowledge and understanding of their subject areas, take on board the feedback they have received from their mock exams, attend interventions that have been put in place and make use of the revision sessions subject leads run on a weekly basis. If you have any concerns about your child's mock exam results, please speak to their teacher and they will be more than happy to talk things through with you.

The unexploded bomb incident in Plymouth last week hit the national headlines and caused significant disruption for many. On the Friday things happened very quickly following the emergency alert sent to mobile phones at lunch time. Fortunately, the operation to take the bomb by military convoy to the Torpoint Ferry slipway, and then out to sea to safely detonate it, was a success. I would like to thank you for your support on the day as it was a very fast-moving situation.



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Our Post 16 Parents' Evening was well attended last week, and at the time of writing we have our Year 10 Parents' Evening on Thursday. These events provide an excellent opportunity for you to find out more about how your child is progressing, to share any worries or concerns you may have, and to understand how we can work together to give your child the best possible chance to succeed in their subject areas.

Although the weather hasn't been kind to us, the College hosted an excellent Year 8 and 9 netball tournament on 20<sup>th</sup> February with seven teams entered from a number of local schools. With our Torpoint A and B Teams coming second and third respectively, and the tournament played in great spirit, this was a great result and well done to all those involved. 

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#### Torpoint Students' Success in UKMT Intermediate Maths Competition!

Fifty of our top mathematicians in Year's 9,10 and 11 took part in the UK Intermediate Maths Challenge last month. The maths challenge is an hour paper that contains a variety of questions that involve puzzles, problems, logic as well as maths, which make them challenging and enjoyable to those taking part. It is a national competition with only the best mathematicians from all over the UK taking part. The paper is designed to challenge the most able students and get them to think about the maths skills that they need to use.

Congratulations to all the students that participated in the challenging competition. They all did very well and many students just missed out on awards. An amazing fifteen students did achieve Bronze, Silver or Gold Awards.

There were eight Bronze Awards in total. These were for Ella, Oscar and Ruben from Year 9, Charlie, Max, Joshua and Levvy from Year 10 and George from Year 11.

There were six Silver Awards in total:

- Josiah, Leo, Ashley and Jake in Year 11 all received Silver Awards.
- Jack was the only student in Year 10 to achieve a Silver Award and he also achieved Best in Year.
- Lincoln was the only student in Year 9 to achieve a Silver Award and he also achieved Best in Year.

Willow in Year 11 was the only student to achieve a Gold Award and she also achieved the title of Best in School! An excellent achievement!


This is a fantastic set of results and well done to all of you!!

Students in Year 8 took part in the latest Employer Encounter on 8<sup>th</sup> February which also coincided with National Apprenticeship week. Students heard from a range of representatives from local businesses about the pathways available including opportunities for apprenticeships as an option after Year 11, or a degree apprenticeship after Year 13. Students considered the advantages of apprenticeships such as earning while you gain a qualification, but also considered the advantages of studying for a degree in higher education.
