Headteacher's Message

Dear Parent/Carer.

Re: Important notification of change to the College Calendar - TCC will be closed to students on Monday 22nd and Tuesday 23rd July due to essential maintenance works.

I am writing to inform you that due to the age of the school building and the requirement to update the electrical and mechanical structures, we will be having extensive building works starting in July for approximately 12 months. This will impact the day to day running of the College and cannot be completed outside of term time.

The first phase of the works involves upgrading the canteen area of the College and is a particularly challenging project. We are therefore required to lengthen the time available to the contractors by closing the College on Monday 22^{nd} and Tuesday 23^{rd} July. I sincerely apologise for any inconvenience this may cause and assure you it is not a decision that has been taken lightly.

We will provide learning activities for students to complete at home during the closure days. If your child is in receipt of Free School Meals, arrangements will be made for you to receive vouchers for the period your child should have been in school. There will also be provision at the College for vulnerable students if required. Parents will be contacted about this in due course.

Below is a more detailed explanation of the works for your information:

Torpoint Community College is typical of many secondary schools within Cornwall having been constructed and extended in multiple phases since the 1960s. The main mechanical and electrical infrastructure serving the schools is coming to an end of its serviceable life, and the distribution routes for these services is particularly complex and in many cases is not suitable for the installation of new services.

Following numerous surveys, it is evident the scope of remedial works required to be undertaken cannot be addressed during summer holiday periods alone. Therefore, construction activities are also being planned to be undertaken throughout term time with a 13 phase programme currently in place. Work is expected to take 12-14 months to complete, with temporary modular classrooms being brought on site (two classrooms) and spare classrooms used to vacate areas to allow a contractor to complete the requisite works.

There is an extensive programme of works planned for 2024/25 including the replacement of the electrical distribution system, replacement of the hot and cold water services running through corridors and domestic hot and cold water in classrooms, repairs to the existing heating distribution pipework where necessary, new data cabling and replacement of the fan convector units. It is also hoped shower cubicles will be fitted in the boys' and girls' PE changing rooms and the units in the Food Technology room replaced and updated.

We have consulted with Cornwall Council, who are fully aware of the scope of works, and who have approved the closure of the College to students at the end of this term. We appreciate the disruption this may cause, and I would like to apologise in advance for this. Unfortunately, we have little control over the extent of the works that need to be undertaken, which is the largest single project of its kind completed in any Cornish school, but they are essential and will future proof the College for many years to come.

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Back in the Summer of 2023, The Box Museum in Plymouth offered a professional development training session for teachers of Art and DT in the South West, which we applied for and have had the pleasure of recently attending. As a result of this, Torpoint Community College was invited to participate in a collaborative project, 'DesignLab Nation', linking The Box Museum, The Victoria and Albert Museum and our school.

After two further training sessions for staff leading on DLN at The Box, and the V & A, TCC were fully prepared for the project. We were able to network with staff members from other local schools who had also been successful in participating in this opportunity, which is heavily subsidized by the V & A.





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DesignLab Nation

On Monday 15th April, a group of our Year 10 Art and Design students set out on day one of our DesignLab Nation experience. Lead by Adam Murray, Education Facilitator at The Box, the students were briefed fully on their Design Brief, entitled 'Plymouth, City of the Future', the goal being; To design and build a model for an existing building in Plymouth to be repurposed and fit for the needs of Plymouth citizens in the year 2050. The students were given a tour of the gallery spaces in The Box and engaged in some drawing and experimentational sculpture workshops, lead by local artist, Anna Boland in the morning as well as a blustery walking/drawing tour of Plymouth in the afternoon.

On Tuesday 16th April, day two of the project began at 5am, with the students travelling to The V&A Museum, in South Kensington, London. The day involved visiting various galleries within the museum, and working with their education facilitators, lead by Mel Whittaker. They participated in further drawing and sculpture workshops during the visit with the goal to source ideas and gain inspiration for their design brief. An exhausted group then arrived back at TCC at 10pm, but the adventure was not by any means over yet!













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
DesignLab Nation



On Friday 19th April, day three, lead by Professor Alejandro De Veynes (Plymouth Uni), Mel Whitakker (V & A), Adam (The Box) and Anna Boland (the artist) the students were invited to explore some of amazing the facilities at Plymouth University. For students interested in STEM, the morning was inspirational, as they explored state of the art technology in their Immersive Media Lab. The students ascended the stairs to then visit the Architecture Department on the top floor of the Roland Levinsky Building. The University students were on hand to answer any questions, and our students saw model-making in progress, both digitally and crafted by hand. Finished models by previous university students were on show in the studio. The view itself was incredible, and the students could see across the city of Plymouth, in readiness for redesigning one of its iconic buildings. In addition, students were treated to a visit to the Immersive Vision Theatre, lead by Professor Mike Phillips, in which you can view films and animation from an immersive dome perspective. Links to technologies used for Careers in Film-making, Animation, Architecture, Heritage work, Biological Sciences, and Health Care were all apparent. With all this inspirational material, the students were then tasked with another sculpting workshop, involving problem-solving and working in teams.

On Monday 22nd April, day 4 of the project, the students were invited back to The Box for a day spent designing and building their models for their final outcomes. They worked diligently in small groups to problem-solve and realise their intentions, guided by Adam and Anna and of course, our own TCC Art team. Their models were a range of well considered, hand-crafted, thoughtful design solutions. They then presented their ideas to the rest of the group, encouraging them to develop their communication skills. The students rose to the challenge, showing maturity and positively engaging throughout the 4 days and we couldn't be prouder of them.



A great trip with great students.










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
