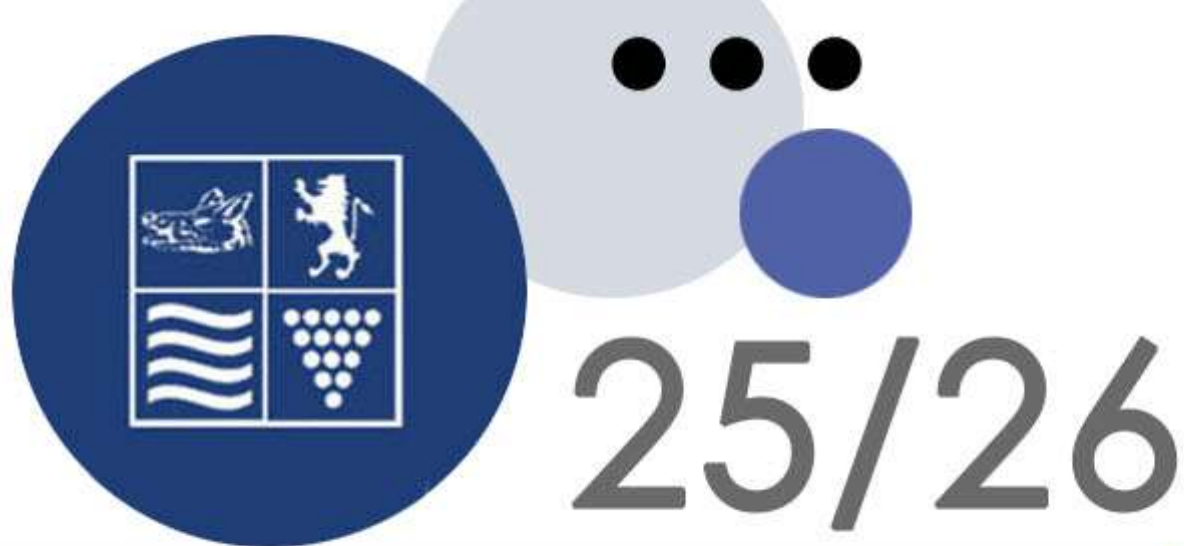

Headteacher's Message

Dear Parents, Carers, and Students,

We are delighted to welcome everyone to the second part of the Autumn Term. Last week began with a productive staff training day, where we focused on celebrating our unique College culture and the improvements we have seen in student attendance, behaviour for learning and the huge number of merits that have been awarded. Staff also explored strategies to remove barriers to learning and received valuable training from the Department for Education on supporting reading in secondary schools.

This week began with Remembrance assemblies led by Mr Truan, our Head of History. The assemblies focused on the First World War and included watching interviews with veterans, helping students reflect on the significance of the poppy as a symbol of remembrance. We were proud to represent the College at the Remembrance Parade and services at St James Church and Sparrow Park in Torpoint. Our student leaders, Ashley and Hannah, accompanied the Headteacher to represent the College at both events, and it was an honour to join our local schools in paying tribute and reflecting on those who gave their lives for our freedom.

Cultural and educational opportunities over the last two weeks have included students from Year's 10, 11, and Post-16 enjoying a trip to Plymouth Theatre Royal to see The Woman in Black, and students visiting the Eden Project to take part in an engaging workshop, broadening their geographical learning beyond the classroom.

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Going to Extremes @The Eden Project

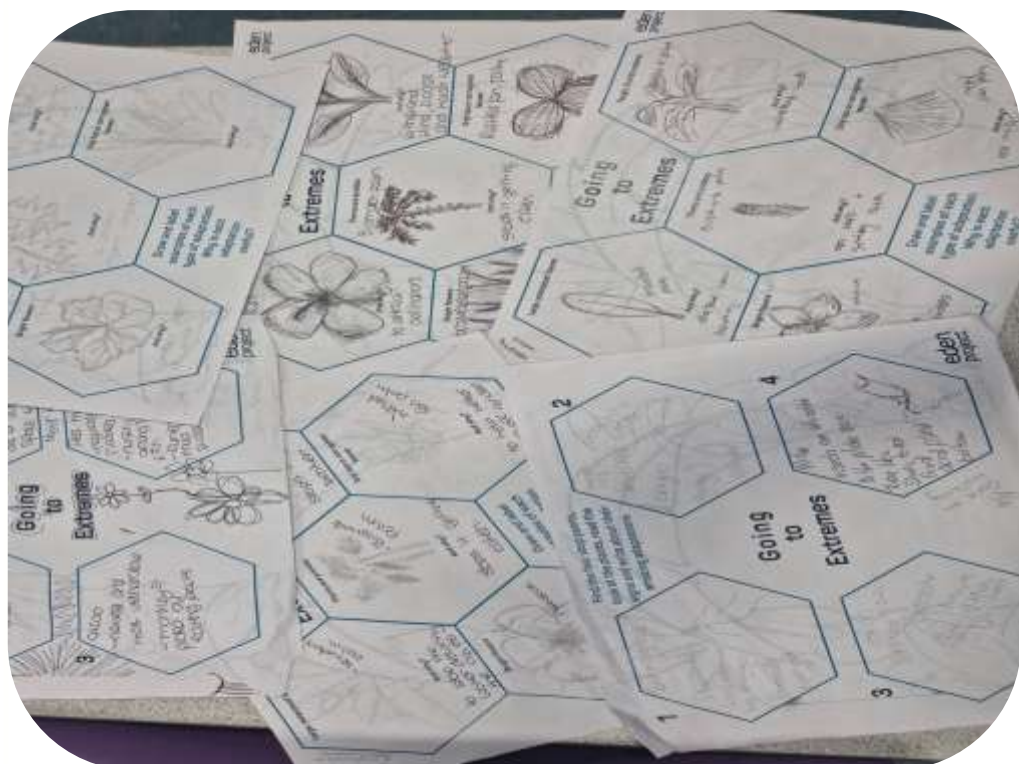


Thirty-five Year 9 students recently took part in the "Going to Extremes" workshop at the Eden Project in Cornwall. The workshop challenged students to think like geographers and scientists, exploring the difficulties that plants face surviving in the tropical rainforest and discovering the incredible adaptations that help them thrive.

After the interactive session in the classroom, students ventured into the Rainforest Biome, where they saw these adaptations up close, from the carnivorous pitcher plant to the resilient mangrove trees. The hands-on experience brought classroom learning to life, helping students to see first-hand how plants have evolved to cope with extreme environments.

Staff at the Eden Project commented on how impeccably behaved our students were throughout the visit, noting their curiosity and enthusiasm for learning. Our Year 9 students did TCC proud, showing great behaviour and a genuine interest in everything they learned. It was a day filled with discovery, teamwork, and inspiration, and every student came away with a deeper appreciation for the wonders of the natural world. All in all, it was a fantastic day out!

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Year 11 Separate Science Biology – Kidney Dissection

Year 11 Separate Science Biology students recently took part in a fascinating practical lesson exploring the structure and function of the kidney. As part of their studies, they carried out a kidney dissection, identifying key structures such as the cortex and medulla.

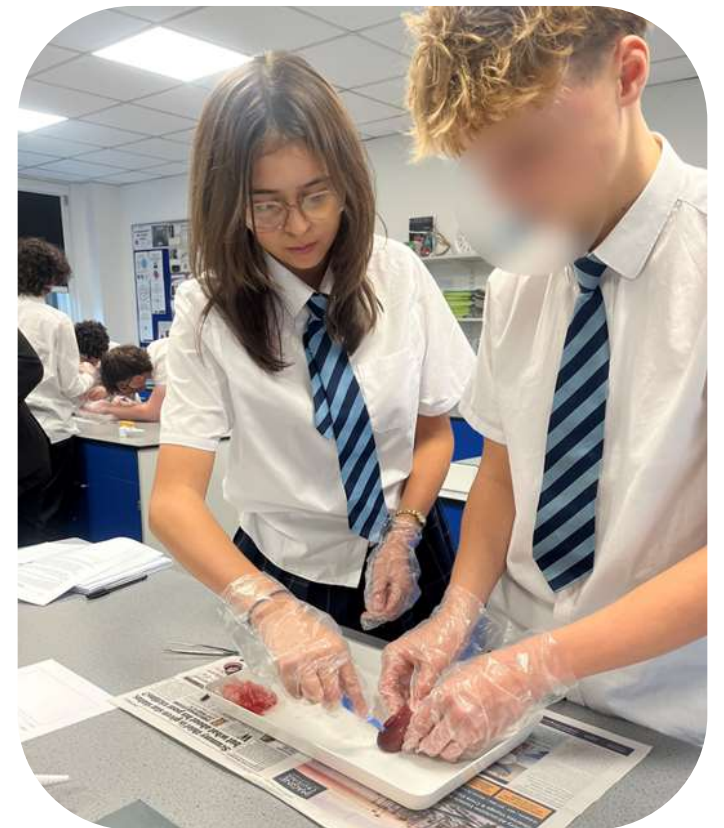
Did you know?

Most people have two kidneys, located under the ribs and above the waist, one on each side of the body. Each kidney is bean-shaped and roughly 10–12 cm long – about the size of a clenched fist.

Kidneys filter around **180 litres of blood every day**, help control red blood cell production, and release hormones that regulate blood pressure.

They produce urine by removing waste products from the body. Kidneys also help keep bones strong and healthy by producing an active form of vitamin D.

Well done to all our Year 11 students for their excellent work and enthusiasm during this practical!



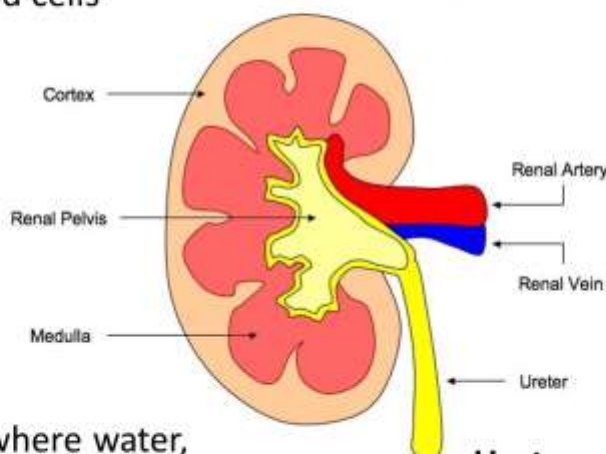
Anatomy of the kidney

Cortex - filters large molecules from the blood
e.g. white blood cells

Renal artery - brings blood to kidney

Pelvis – collects urine

Renal vein - takes blood away from kidney



Medulla - where water, salt and urea are removed from blood

Ureter - takes urine from kidney to bladder



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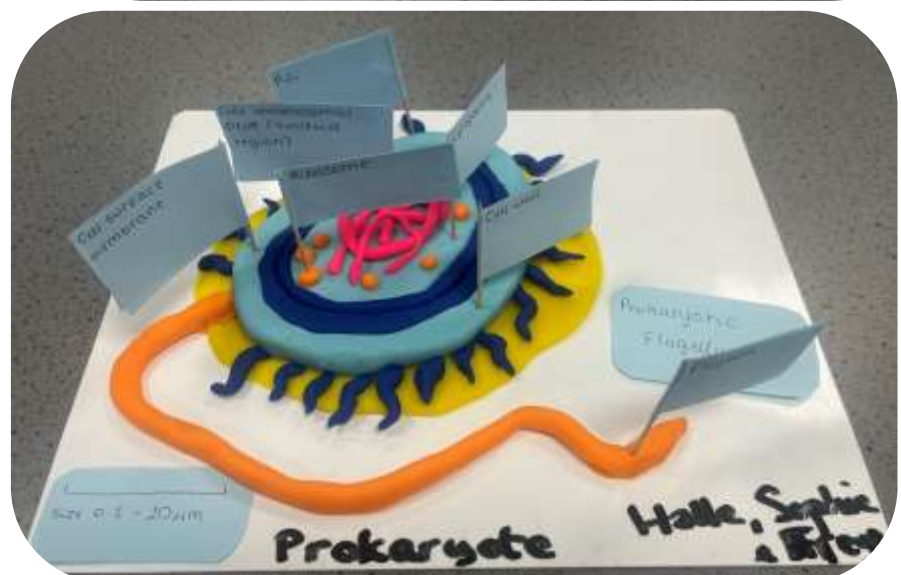
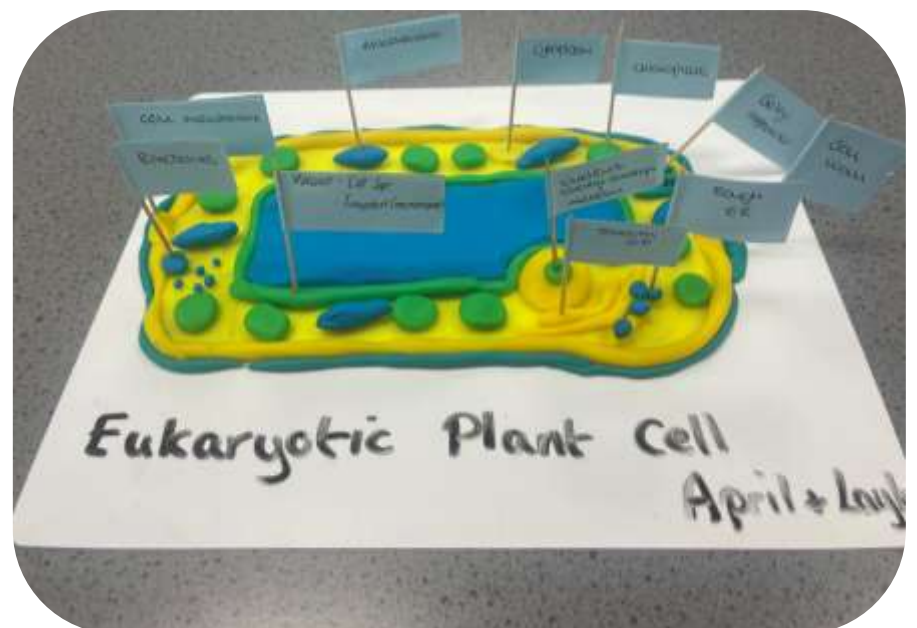
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Year 12 Biology

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Antibullying



Spotting Bullying in Group Chats or Games

Bullying doesn't just happen at school - it often follows children home through group chats and online games. These spaces can feel unregulated, making it easier for exclusion, name-calling, or peer pressure to thrive.

 Look out for signs such as:



- Mood changes after being on a device
- Sudden avoidance of certain apps or games
- Secretive or anxious behaviour when checking messages
- Asking to leave a group or delete an account without saying why

 In online games, bullying may show up as:

- Teammates targeting your child unfairly
- Offensive messages during or after gameplay
- Being excluded from team play or repeatedly "kicked" from games

 What You Can Do:

- Ask open-ended questions like, "How's the group chat going?" or "Who do you usually game with?"
- Help your child block/report bullies, and encourage respectful digital behaviour.
- Remind them they can always come to you or a trusted adult if something feels wrong.

Spotting and Preventing Online Grooming

Online grooming is when someone builds a relationship with a young person to exploit or manipulate them. It can happen through games, social media, or messaging apps—and it's not always obvious at first.

Young people may believe they are speaking to someone their own age, or feel flattered by attention, gifts, or compliments. That's why it's so important to keep lines of communication open.



 What You Can Do:

- 1** Talk regularly about who your child speaks to online - and how those people treat them.
- 2** Encourage them to never share personal information, images, or locations online.
- 3** Reassure your child that they can always come to you if something doesn't feel right.

Sixth form Psychology Zoo Trip

Last week, our Year 12 Psychology students had the exciting opportunity to see psychology in action during a visit to Paignton Zoo. They attended a fascinating lecture by Dr. Farmer, who explained how psychological principles are applied in a zoological setting.

Students learned how researchers assess the emotional resilience of giraffes and how zookeepers use various data collection methods to monitor animal behaviour. They even had the chance to carry out their own behavioural observations using an ethogram, focusing on an animal of their choice.

It was a fantastic day that brought classroom learning to life and gave students a real-world insight into the practical applications of psychology. The trip was thoroughly enjoyed by all!

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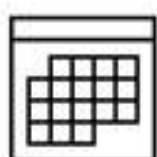

Effective communication between parents and school staff is vital to ensure your child receives the best possible support and education. This guide outlines the appropriate channels for different types of enquiries and sets clear expectations to help foster respectful and productive interactions.

Who to Contact for Different Types of Inquiries:



General Day-to-Day Inquiries

For routine questions or concerns about your child's school life, please contact your child's **Tutor** in the first instance. They are best placed to address most day-to-day matters and provide the necessary support.



Higher-Level Concerns

If your concern is more significant or goes beyond everyday issues, you should contact your child's **Head of Year**. They can address broader issues relating to your child's academic progress, behaviour, or well-being.



Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Concerns

For specific concerns related to your child's additional learning needs or their SEND provision, please contact the **SENDCo** (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator). *Please note: The SENDCo should only be contacted for higher-level concerns regarding your child's support needs. For more general issues, we kindly ask that you contact your child's Tutor first. This ensures concerns are handled efficiently and by the right staff member.*



Curriculum-Related Concerns or Major Issues

For concerns about the school curriculum, significant school-wide matters, or if you wish to make a formal complaint, please contact a member of the **College Leadership Team (CLT)**. They are equipped to address higher-level issues and ensure that school policies are followed appropriately.

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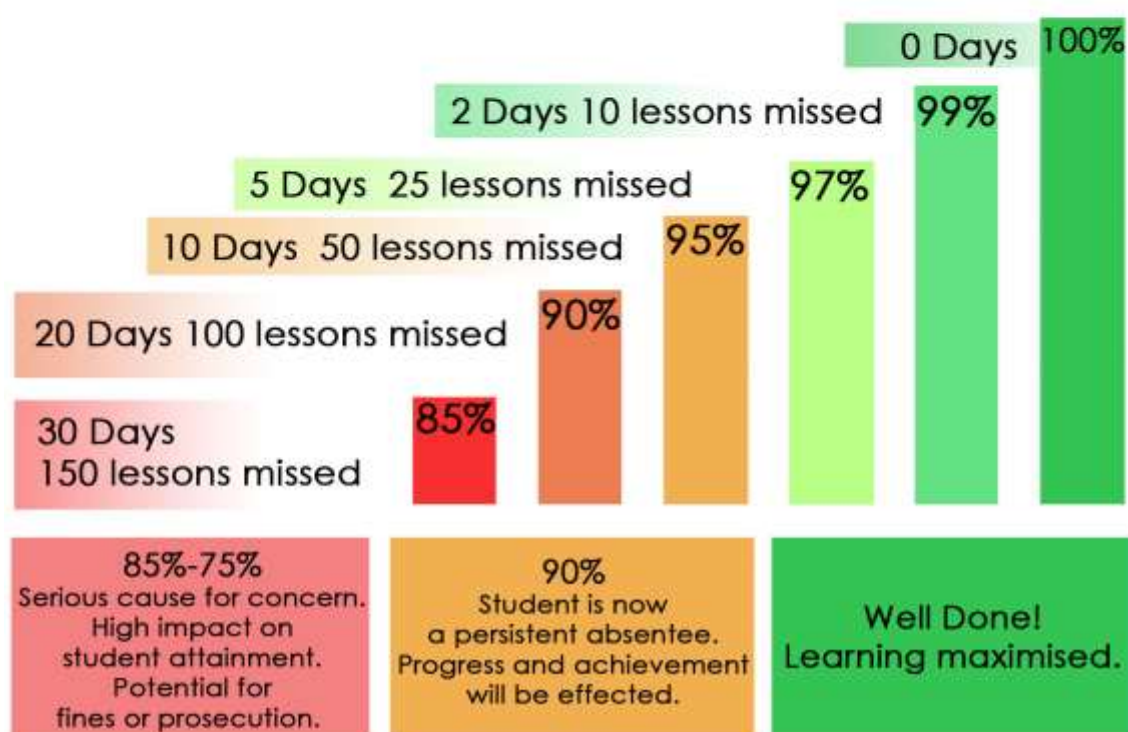

Good attendance

means:

Being in school at least **95%+** of the time.



Attendance- Information about Penalty Notices

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.



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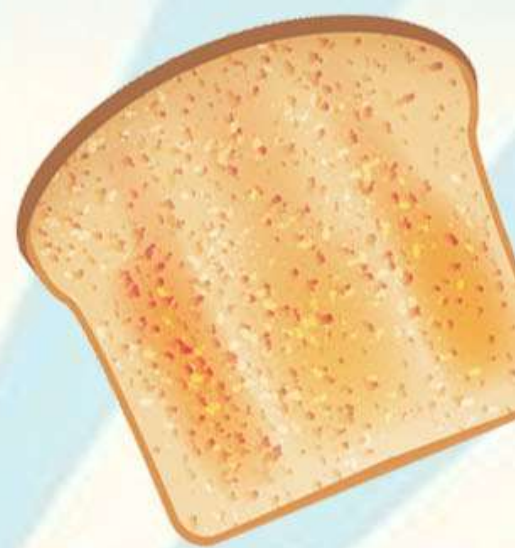

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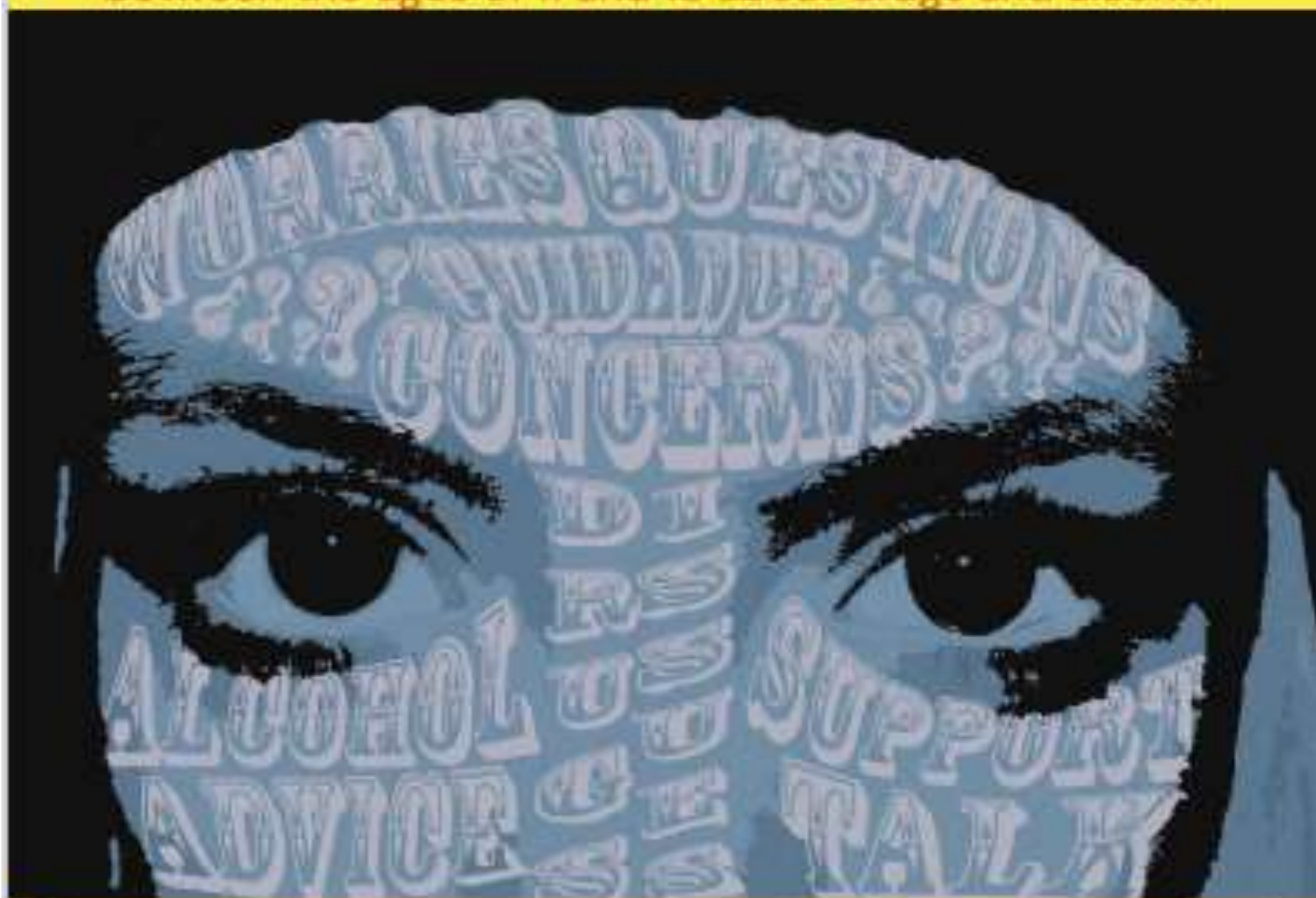
