Headteacher's Message

On Monday 9th March, Torpoint Community College joined Carbeile Junior School and Torpoint Nursery and Infant School to mark Commonwealth Day at Sparrow Park in Torpoint. The event brought together our local school community for a shared moment of reflection and celebration.

Commonwealth Day is observed annually on the second Monday in March and celebrates the shared values, history and cooperation of the 56 member nations of the Commonwealth. This year's theme, *"Unlocking opportunities together for a prosperous Commonwealth,"* highlights the importance of collaboration, inclusion and opportunity across nations.

A key feature of the day is the global "Fly a Flag for the Commonwealth" initiative. At 11:00 am, communities around the world raise the Commonwealth flag as a symbol of unity, democracy and respect for diversity. Our gathering at Sparrow Park mirrored hundreds of similar ceremonies taking place across towns, cities and schools worldwide.

The event provided a valuable opportunity for students to reflect on the importance of global citizenship and the role they can play in shaping a more connected and prosperous future.

Over the past two weeks, the College has been busy with a wide range of activities, showcasing the many opportunities and experiences our students benefit from both inside and outside the classroom.

Our GCSE Year 11 Food students have been undertaking their practical examinations, producing an impressive array of dishes. Staff were invited to sample their work and provide feedback, which forms an important part of their coursework. The quality, creativity and confidence on display have been fantastic, and students have greatly appreciated the support and encouragement from across the college.

In the performing arts, our Year 11 Drama students have been preparing for their final practical examination, and then performing to a visiting examiner. This was a significant milestone in their GCSE course, and students have worked incredibly hard in rehearsals to refine their performances. Year 10 and 11 students have also visited the theatre to see *Othello*, while Year 12 students travelled to the University of Exeter to focus on UCAS preparation. There has also been a drama performance from a visiting company for students following examination classes in Spanish and French.

Geography field trips have continued this week, and our 35 and 45 mile Ten Tors teams have completed their first overnight camp and expedition on Dartmoor in challenging weather conditions last weekend.

Year 10 students recently took part in a careers event focused on exploring future pathways. The event provided an excellent opportunity for students to engage in a "speed networking" format, speaking directly with a wide range of employers, education providers and former students. Representatives from local industries, further education colleges, apprenticeship providers and universities were on hand to share insights into different career routes and the skills required for success. Students asked thoughtful questions, gained valuable advice and developed a greater understanding of the opportunities available to them after Year 11 and beyond. The event was a highly positive experience and an important step in helping students plan for their futures.

Finally, we have received wonderful feedback about our Year 7 students, who have been praised by visiting professionals for their engagement, behaviour and positive attitude during recent sessions. They have been excellent ambassadors for the college during a PSHE session focusing on dental hygiene.

Subject Spotlight: Art



Year 8 have been working on a project inspired by Birds represented in the collage work of artist Mark Hearld, exploring shape, texture and composition. The students have created a collage design onto a mount board backing which they then developed into collograph prints. This is achieved by rolling ink over the design and printing the image onto separate paper. The results were a lively collection of prints shown here.

In response to their investigation, students have developed their own pottery designs. Each student then created a ceramic dish in terracotta clay inspired by their research. Subject Spotlight: Art



Year 10 have been busy working on their coursework based on a theme chosen by them. Each student is developing their own collection of work inspired by that theme. Currently the students have been exploring coil building, slab building and press-moulded ceramic techniques. The work shows students in the process of exploring these techniques.



Year 11 are currently working towards their final GCSE exam after Easter. They pick a theme set by the exam board and have from January to develop a collection of preparation work on that starting point. This can include Artist's Research, Photography, Drawing, Painting, Print-making and 3D work. Exam board rules mean that we are unable to show current student examination work.

Year 12 are working on their portfolio of evidence based on a theme that is personal to them. They are working hard on developing their drawing skills as well as building on their sketchbooks.

Year 13 are also working towards their final A Level Art exams in the summer term when they will create a 15 hour conclusion piece to a theme set by the exam board but selected by them from a number of options. We are proud of the A Level course and the hard work of our dedicated students.

Science Week 2026: Curiosity in Action

Science Week 2026 was a fantastic celebration of curiosity, creativity, and discovery across all year groups. From engaging challenges to cross-curricular learning, students explored how science connects to every aspect of our lives.

The week began with a bake sale on Monday, where students from all year groups were tasked with creating cakes with a science theme. The entries were fantastic, showing a great deal of thought, care, imagination, and curiosity. Enya's interpretation of the lungs was particularly clever, earning her first place. We especially liked the inside/outside design. In second place were Bessie's buns and her "question" cake which were immaculate and perfectly in keeping with this year's theme. Lily's science-themed biscuits were highly professional, and we were impressed by her variety, including both atom biscuits and flask biscuits – earning her third place. Other entries included a giant red blood cell cake, a plant cell, a science book, a DNA experimental extravaganza and more. We would like to thank all students who took part – we truly were very impressed and the students who bought cakes enjoyed eating them!

Year 7 students took part in the exciting "*Six Clicks to Science*" challenge, where they navigated from popular culture topics to scientific concepts using only Wikipedia links. This activity brilliantly demonstrated how science underpins everything, from music and sport to films and social media, encouraging students to think critically about real-world connections.

Year 8 students became citizen scientists, contributing to real scientific research through platforms such as Zooniverse. They learned how everyday people can support global studies by analysing data, observing wildlife, and even exploring distant galaxies. This highlighted the power of collaboration and showed that anyone can play a role in scientific discovery.

Meanwhile, Year 9 explored the theme "*Science is Everything*" through a series of lessons across multiple subjects. Students discovered how science links to PSHE, languages, food technology, geography, history, PE, computing, and English. They examined important topics such as diversity in STEM, global collaboration, sustainability, climate science, technological innovation, and science communication. Inspiring real-world professionals helped challenge stereotypes and demonstrated the wide range of careers connected to science.

Throughout the week, one key message stood out: curiosity is at the heart of all scientific progress. Whether investigating food, sport, climate, or communication, students saw how asking questions and exploring ideas can lead to meaningful change.

A Level English Literature Trip – *Othello* Cinema Screening

Our A Level English Literature students recently enjoyed a trip to the cinema to watch a screening of the most recent London stage production of *Othello* by William Shakespeare. As *Othello* is one of the core texts studied as part of the AQA A Level English Literature course, the visit provided a fantastic opportunity for students to see the play performed by professional actors and to experience how a modern production interprets Shakespeare's tragedy.

Watching the performance helped students bring the play to life beyond the classroom. Seeing key moments unfold on stage – from the development of Othello and Desdemona's relationship to Iago's manipulation – allowed students to think more deeply about character, staging, and dramatic tension. It also gave them new ideas to draw upon as they prepare for their examinations.

The evening was not only academically valuable but also great fun. Students thoroughly enjoyed experiencing the atmosphere of a live theatre production in a cinema setting and discussing their favourite moments afterwards. Trips like this are a wonderful way to enrich the study of literature and remind us that Shakespeare's plays were written to be performed and enjoyed.

We look forward to many more opportunities to bring the texts that our students study to life in this way.

PSHEe: Health Education

Dental Hygiene Talks from Plymouth University Dental Outreach

We have been delighted to welcome Melissa and Lisa from the Dental Education Outreach Team from Plymouth University to Torpoint Community College. They have delivered a lesson about Dental Hygiene to each Year 7 class in a recent PSHEe lesson. All Year 7 students were given a goodie bag containing a toothbrush, toothpaste and a 2-minute timer and were given advice and tips on improving and maintaining their oral health.

Here are Melissa and Lisa with their fantastic mouth models and props used in the sessions:

Here are their top tips for oral health:

- Brush your teeth and gums twice a day for 2 minutes
- Use a pea sized amount of Fluoride toothpaste
- Spit out the toothpaste and do not rinse
- Keep sugary snacks and drinks to mealtimes
- Visit the dentist regularly



Dental disease prevalence (Statistics from [UK Oral Health Statistics Overview](#))

- Almost one-in-four adults in the UK (41%) have untreated tooth decay.
- 9% of adults show signs of severe gum disease.
- 5% of adults in England have no natural teeth. The average number of natural teeth among adults is 25, with 84% retaining at least 21 teeth – considered a functional dentition.
- More than one-in-five five-year-olds in England (23.7%) have obvious decay in their teeth.
- By Year 6 (age 10–11), 12.1% of children in the South West have tooth decay.
- Tooth decay is the leading cause of hospital admissions for children aged 5–9. In 2022–23, there were 31,165 hospital admissions for children and young people under 19 to extract decayed teeth, costing the NHS £40.7 million.



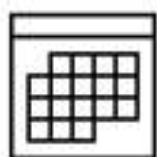

Effective communication between parents and school staff is vital to ensure your child receives the best possible support and education. This guide outlines the appropriate channels for different types of enquiries and sets clear expectations to help foster respectful and productive interactions.

Who to Contact for Different Types of Inquiries:



General Day-to-Day Inquiries

For routine questions or concerns about your child's school life, please contact your child's **Tutor** in the first instance. They are best placed to address most day-to-day matters and provide the necessary support.



Higher-Level Concerns

If your concern is more significant or goes beyond everyday issues, you should contact your child's **Head of Year**. They can address broader issues relating to your child's academic progress, behaviour, or well-being.



Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) Concerns

For specific concerns related to your child's additional learning needs or their SEND provision, please contact the **SENDCo** (Special Educational Needs and Disabilities Coordinator). *Please note: The SENDCo should only be contacted for higher-level concerns regarding your child's support needs. For more general issues, we kindly ask that you contact your child's Tutor first. This ensures concerns are handled efficiently and by the right staff member.*



Curriculum-Related Concerns or Major Issues

For concerns about the school curriculum, significant school-wide matters, or if you wish to make a formal complaint, please contact a member of the **College Leadership Team (CLT)**. They are equipped to address higher-level issues and ensure that school policies are followed appropriately.

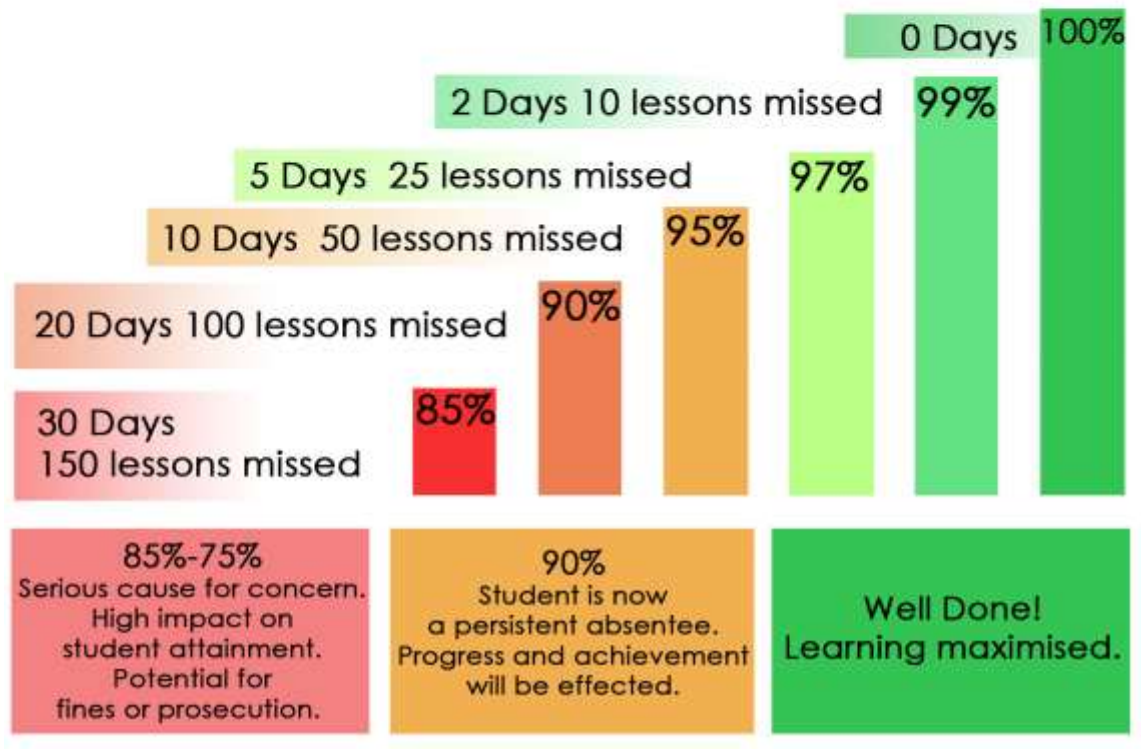

EVERYDAY COUNTS

Why is attendance important for my child's education?

Good attendance means: Being in school at least **95%+** of the time.



Attendance- Information about Penalty Notices

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid after this but within 28 days.

If your child is further absent from school without authorisation within any 3-year period, you will be committing a further offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices for a second offence are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £160, payable within 28 days.

Importantly, fines per parent will be capped to two fines within any three-year period. Once this limit has been reached, other action such as a parenting order or prosecution will be considered.

Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may also result in legal action. If you are prosecuted and attend court because your child has not been attending school, you could get a fine of up to £2,500. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Absence not authorised by the school may also result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Again, Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court, including legal costs.

Money raised from fines is only used by the local authority to cover the costs of administering the system, and to fund attendance support. Any extra money is returned to the government.

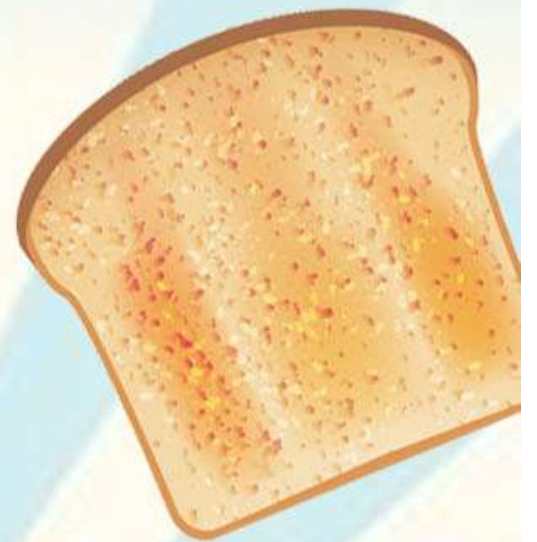
